Topic - socialistic principles under DPSP

Introduction

Embodying the ideology of socialism, these principles lay down the framework of a democratic socialist state. Overall, they strive to establish a welfare state by providing for social and economic justice.

Article 38 To promote the welfare of the people by securing a social order permeated by justice—social, economic, and political—and to minimize inequalities in income, status, facilities, and opportunities.
