<b>UF-LW-232</b>	<b>CRMINOLOGY AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE ADMINISTRATION</b>	An Indian Penal Code (IPC) defining crime and prescribing appropriate punishments was adopted in 1860, prepared by the first Law Commission of India. It was developed in line with the English criminal law. Code of Criminal Procedure was enacted in 1861 and established the rules to be followed in all stages.
