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2.2.1: The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes to cater to differential learning needs of the student.

For recognizing and identifying learning levels of the students, Jayoti Vidyapeeth Women's University follows continuous Learnership, Mentorship Process and by providing experiential learning.

After admission, two levels of Induction/orientation programmes at the University, Faculty/ department is conducted for all students immediately after joining campus, by which students get a basic understanding about the University curriculum and its teaching methodology. They are encouraged to form connections, make friends, know their faculty members, and be involved in their campus life. During orientation they also learn more about the campus and location of facilities & services.

Based on the Communication Test/Psychometric Test after 1st month of the admission, teacher analysis the students in three categories (slow learner, average learner, and advanced learners).

By differentiating these three elements, teachers offer different approaches to what students learn, how they learn it, and how they demonstrate what they've learned. While the old students are categorized in – slow, average, and advanced learner based on their percentage in the latest semester/year (on half yearly performance). Efforts are made by the mentor for up gradation of learning levels of the students.

University offers Mentorship Programs with the following Objectives:

- 1. To hear and solve the academic and personal problems (to a limited extent) of students.
- 2. To support slow learners by providing remedial classes, counselling sessions, Interactive sessions and encouraging them to participate in knowledge and skill enhancing activities.
- 3. To direct average learners towards advanced learning.
- 4. To refine learning opportunities so they're effective for each student.
- 5. To monitor the match between learner and learning and adjust as required.
- 6. To make advanced learners uncover deeper layers of learning.
- 7. To help students in their overall development
- 8. To make students stress free & happy.

For the successful implementation of Mentorship, Academic mentors are allotted to students as per their learning levels who help and guide them in their academic and other nonacademic activities. There is a communication improvement session for both slow and average learners for personality development. Appropriate mentoring with additional teaching and motivation helps the students to meet their academic goals. The learners are promoted to attend classes regularly that act as criteria to upgrade their learnership. They are promoted to the next level of learnership after attending the following level of minimum attendance and other activities.



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Teachers offer different approaches to what students learn, how they learn, and how they demonstrate it. Advanced learners are awarded with A** and given 3 additional marks as performance reward to motivate them and others to enhance their learning level. The faculty challenges the students to a higher level of learning, using an active form of learning. Prompt and immediate feedback is given. The Mentor Teacher identifies the student's problem and gives solutions; the difficulties of the students in their academic progression are identified. They are given moral and psychological support which is conducive to an environmentally friendly atmosphere for learning. Mentors nurturing skills in students like participating, observing, reacting, discovering, problem solving, evaluating, planning & challenging etc. The Mentor Mentee Program is an innovative program from the start of the academic journey of the student till the Mentee graduates from the University.

Additionally, University provides language training for non-english speaking students and provide foreign language classes as per the interest of the students. Students also given Training of Computer of Fundamentals, Use of ICT Tools, and provides rich learning exposure through various activities including research writing and publication, attending knowledge enhancement workshops, seminar, conferences, internship/dissertation/ projects, industrial/Academic/Field visits, to enhance student exposure and providing them experiential learning experience. Programmes for student enrichment and upgrade of skills are regularly organized.

University also imparts training for skill development and life skills such as communication skills, interpersonal skills, Soft Skill Development, Personality development, Career counselling, Time Management and Promotes digital learning through MOOC, LMS which enhances accessibility,

The overall Learning Process is nurtured by conducting various programmes/events and activities like Guest Lectures, Workshops by Eminent Speakers and experts form Academics and Industry both from time to time to update the knowledge of the students as per industry and society needs and students are progressed for Industrial Visits, Inter-University, Starte National and International Sports/Cultural/Arts/Research Competitions, Extra-Curricular Activities, Community Development Activities

Orientation:

After admission, students get an orientation session for a basic understanding about the University curriculum and its teaching methodology. They are encouraged to form connections, make friends, know their faculty members, and be involved in campus life. During orientation they learn more about the campus and location of facilities & services.

Students are categorized in three categories as per their performance assessed and evaluated by taking Communication Test/Psychometric Test and Overall Academic Performance.

- Less than 40%- Slow learner
- 41%-75%- Average Learner
- Above 75%- Advanced Learner



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Mentorship Process

- Regular 1 hour subject specific extra class for slow learners
- Providing counseling sessions to slow learners
- Motivate weak students to ask questions in class to clear their doubts, eventually building their confidence.
- Career mentoring to advanced learners
- Setting high end goals for advanced learners
- Assigning Innovative Projects to Advanced learners
- Motivating average and advanced learners for interdisciplinary training

Academic mentors are allotted to students as per their learning levels who help them in their academic and other nonacademic activities. There is a communication improvement session for both slow and average learners for personality development. Appropriate mentoring with additional teaching and motivation helps the students to meet their academic goals. There is an allotment of career mentors to advanced learners with whom they can have one-to-one interaction. Career mentor provides necessary guidance for goal achievement to advanced learners. Moreover, University provides appropriate platform to advanced learner to showcase their talent which helps in enhancing their talent and personality.

The old students are categorized in – slow, average, and advanced learner based on their percentage in the latest semester/year (on half yearly performance). Efforts are made by the mentor for up gradation of learning levels of the students.

The learners are promoted to attend classes regularly that act as criteria to upgrade their learnership. They are promoted to next level of learnership after attending following level of minimum attendance and other activities:

Up gradation Process of Slow Learners to Average:

- 1. Ensuring regularity and specified attendance in classes.
- 2. Providing extra classes in required subjects.
- 3. Peer Teaching (Sr student helping Jr student).
- 4. Ensuring continuous individualized monitoring by mentor.
- 5. Providing communication classes
- 6. Ensuring a stress free and happy learning atmosphere for the students.
- 7. Providing learning flexibility through Bilingual explanation, writing and discussions are imparted to the slow learners for better understanding.
- 8. Stimulating and Encouraging students' inner talent and skills.
- 9. Encouraging students to become verbal, confident, and effective Lerner.



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Up gradation of Average Learners to Advance:

- 1. Ensuring the regularity of the student in classes.
- 2. Providing extra classes if required
- 3. Students are encouraged to be a research-oriented and participate in research writing, publication and attend in various Seminars/ Conferences/Workshops/ Competitions organized at National & International Platforms
- 4. Participation of the students in the in-house competitions such as Debate, Group Discussion
- 5. Promoting advanced students in leadership roles.
- 6. Providing Career guidance to encourage advanced learners to participate in state/national/international level exams such as GATE, NET, SET, GRE, CAT and civil service exams.

Mentoring the Advanced Learners:

- 1. Continuous mentoring about career.
- 2. Inculcating the thinking towards idea generation and research.
- 3. Regular communication with the parents.
- 4. Giving more opportunities related to presentations regarding latest advancement in her discipline.
- 5. Ensuring the happiness of the students.
- 6. Ensuring the active participation of students in maximum activities.

Mentorship Process:

- 1. Taking psychometric test/ Communication Test after the 1st month of the admission.
- 2. Regular 1 hour subject specific extra class for slow learners (3:00 PM-4:00 PM)
- 3. Weekly 1-hour extra class for average learners
- 4. Career mentoring to advanced learners
- 5. Monthly learnership review based on psychometric test/ Communication Test
- 6. Change learners' status on 'My Academic Portal.'
- 7. Putting extra efforts for the progression of slow learners and average learners
- 8. Setting high end goals for advanced learn


