The Convener Board of Studies Prof. Dr. Shobha Lal welcomed all the members and attendees to the meeting. The agenda of the meeting was stated and placed before the members

Agenda1: To confirm the last meeting Minutes of Board of Studies

All the members of BOS confirmed and approved of the meeting minutes of last Board of Studies

Agenda 2: To discuss the proposal and approval of the new courses for BA (Hons.) in Political Science and BA (Hons.) in Economics Programmes to be introduced in the academic session 2021-22.

The Convener gave brief introduction to the agenda. The focus was on the discussion of the proposed specialization program in **Political Science and Economics**.

Dr Shahnawaz Alam presented the proposed syllabus for BA (Hons.) in Economics which were accepted with minor changes that accommodated some excellent suggestions to bridge the industry-academia gap and while making some finer corrections at the same time

Dr. Sanjay Bundela presented the proposed syllabus for BA (Hons.) in Pol. Science .
BOS discussed and reviewed the syllabus contents and approved as follows:

Duration: 3 years (6 semesters)

Core Subjects designed and approved by BOS: Political Theory, Microeconomics, International Economics, Public Policy, Indian Economic Development and Policy , and Development Economics

Assessment: Semester-based exams, assignments, and project work.

Internship/Project: Inclusion of an internship or research project in the final year.

It was clarified that the proposal had been reviewed by the **Board of Studies** in 2020. The **BA (Hons.) in Political Science and Economics** program was unanimously approved to be introduced in the academic year 2021-22.

Members approve the syllabus and recommend for consideration the Academic Council.

Agenda 3: To discuss and approve new courses the B.A. (Journalism) program as per Industry demand

BOS members discussed to revise the syllabus of BA Journalism which should be focused to offer students a comprehensive understanding of media history and traditional communication methods. Ms. Diksha Saxena BOS member presented the course details to be included in the syllabus of BA Journalism

A. History of Media

- **Objective:**
To trace the evolution of media from its early origins to modern digital platforms, analysing key events, technologies, and social impacts.
- **Learning Outcomes:**
Students will develop a historical perspective on media and understand the transitions and challenges across different eras.

Traditional Media of Communication

- **Objective:**
To explore traditional communication methods rooted in cultural practices, focusing on folk media, storytelling, and interpersonal channels.
- **Learning Outcomes:**
Students will appreciate indigenous media forms and their potential in today's media landscape, with emphasis on community-based communication strategies.

The Board of Studies approved the development and design of the following courses:

- **History of Media - I Sem (Major Core Subject)**
- **Traditional Media of Communication- II Sem (Major Core Subject)**

Members highlighted the importance of these courses in broadening students' understanding of both historical and indigenous communication systems.

The finalized syllabus will be prepared and submitted to the **Academic Council** for approval. The new courses are to be introduced in **Semester I and II** of the **B.A. (Journalism)** program starting from the **New academic session** after approval of Academic Council.

Collaboration with media professionals and cultural institutions will be explored for guest lectures and fieldwork opportunities.

Agenda 4: To Introduce new University Mission Courses (Compulsory Courses)

- a. Gau Gyan Science
- b. Military Science & Civil Defence

The Convener explained that the agenda to align the university's curriculum with its mission of holistic education, by introducing two compulsory courses: **Gau Gyan Science** and **Military Science & Civil Defence** with an aim to enhance students' understanding of traditional knowledge systems and national security and disaster preparedness.

BOS members reviewed the course contents and its relevance for implementation in University curriculum

Study of Gau Gyan Science

- **Objective:** To introduce students to the scientific and cultural significance of indigenous cattle (Gau) in India, fostering awareness about sustainable agriculture, environmental conservation, and traditional practices.
- **Key Topics to Include:**
 - a. Significance of Gau in current scenario
 - b. Anatomy of Gau
 - c. Gaumutra and its significance
 - d. Role of cows in sustainable agriculture (panchagavya, organic farming).
 - e. Medicinal uses of cow by-products.
 - f. Cultural, economic, and spiritual relevance of cattle in Indian traditions.
 - g. Impact of cattle rearing on biodiversity and climate change.

Learning Outcomes:

Students will gain knowledge of sustainable practices involving indigenous livestock and develop a cultural appreciation of traditional agricultural methods.

Military Science & Civil Defence

- **Objective:** To equip students with basic military knowledge and skills in civil defence, fostering discipline, physical fitness, and preparedness for natural disasters and emergencies.
- **Key Topics to Include:**
 - Importance of Military Science
 - Concept and Evolution of Military Science
 - Self-defence training and physical fitness.
 - Role Of Women in Military Science & Defense
 - Overview of India's military heritage and armed force's structure.
- **Learning Outcomes:**

Students will develop skills in emergency response and disaster management, fostering national responsibility and personal discipline.

The BOS unanimously approved the introduction of **Gau Gyan Science** and **Military Science & Civil Defence** as compulsory courses under **University Mission Courses**.

The Convener thanked the members for their valuable input. It was decided that the draft syllabi would be circulated among the faculty for feedback, and the final version will be presented for approval at the next Academic Council meeting.
