(57) Abstract :

Herbal cosmetics are used in recent time for safe use. The majority of the components are chemical ingredients which are often not useful for the. The aim of this investigation is to prepare herbal lip gel formulations to avoid the lip problems which are caused by environmental and some chemically prepared lip gel. The herbal lip gel is specially prepared to healing of lip problems containing extracts of Lavandula (Lavender) and Calendula officinalis (Calendula) and aloe vera gel. Aloe vera is used to make gel and also to provide moisturizing effect to lip gel. In this patent herbal lip gel is produced by the use of plant extraction method and prepared lip gel could be commercialized as described for ~treatment of wounds and dryness in lipsTM. The formulated lip gel was evaluated for its organoleptic and physical properties as per standards specified by Bureau of Indian Standards and compare with marketed toothpaste formulations. Lab made herbal lip gel was formulated by suitable ingredients to get formulation more stable.
